SUMMER ASSIGNMENT: Reflective Essay

A **reflective essay** is an essay that is about you and your thinking. However, you will need evidence to back up your reflections. While writing a reflective paper, you describe the things you have learned or express your views on some experience. Reflective essays are typically personal writings about an experience, but they can be made up as well.

Elements of a Reflective Essay:

- Minimum 4 paragraphs
- Being subjective and including **personal emotions**, **feelings**, **and experiences**. In addition, there should be a **balance** between good and bad experiences.
- Investing time in reflective writing.
- Being analytical on the subject matter.
- Giving the writing a nice flow.
- Write in the first person.
- Writing experiences in the past tense, e.g., <u>I learned</u>,
- Include a Thesis Statement is what you learned from your experiences

Possible topics:

- 2. What is something you accomplished this year that makes you proud?
- 3. What was the nicest thing someone in our class did for you this year?
